How one nurse has lit a flame of hope

Ziva Chanukah – Head Nurse of Oncology, tells the following story:

"Tamar, a young mother of six from Hadera, fell victim to breast cancer and was treated at a local hospital. Following chemotherapy, her tumour marker test indicated that she would benefit from the drug Herceptin. At the time, Herceptin was not federally approved in Israel, nor would it be included in the general basket of healthcare treatments for every citizen. Added to which it was very expensive.

The cancer metastasised to the liver and her bones and Tamar was told she had six months to live.

Dejected and feeling hopeless, Tamar went home and began to compose letters to her children



people, regardless of faith or politics, was the first campaign of its type. The response was overwhelming, with thousands of texts received and an Early Day Motion in Parliament was brought by Andrew Dismore, MP for Hendon. The campaign also gained international press in The Jerusalem Post and New York JTA. The initiative was facilitated by the International Committee of the Red Cross, and funds were shared between their work in Gaza medical centres and Laniado Hospital.

preparing them to be orphans, and writing of her will and dreams for them. She asked her oldest child if he wouldn't mind having his bar mitzvah early so that she could witness at least one simcha in her family.

Upon hearing the news, Tamar's community rallied together to support her in her last few months – preparing meals, making arrangements for her children and their future support. One woman in the community then stood up and defiantly asked why hadn't a second opinion been sought?

She brought Tamar to Laniado Hospital where I saw her initially and as she began to speak I realised that she was preparing to die. I said to her, 'Tamar! Stop preparing to die. You have every reason to live and I will do everything in my power to have you live as long a life as possible!'

From then on, I took Tamar through all our workshops on positive thinking, laughter and art therapy to lift her mood and strengthen her mind and spirit. We follow the ethos of the founder who said that Laniado should improve the spiritual and physical wellbeing of each patient in tandem to create an optimum cure.

At the same time, the Herceptin drug became available and we were able to offer it to her.

Tamar's children became part of the cure and played a big part in shaping her positive outlook in life.

It is now three-and-a-half years later. Tamar is alive and still undergoing treatment but has lived to see two happy occasions in her family and her children bring her to the ward every day."

Together with your help Laniado UK has purchased two PCM Syringe Pumps, which administer pain relief for cancer patients.

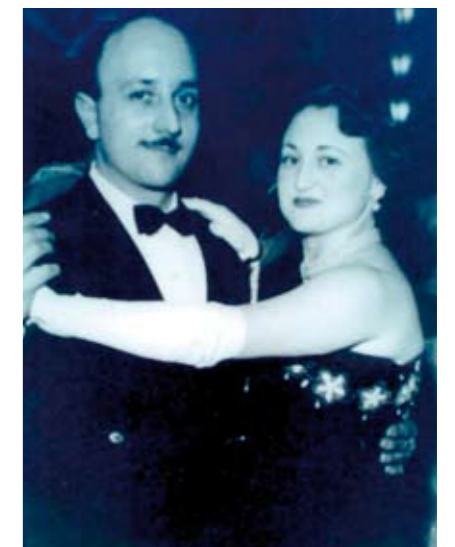
The Maternity Centre currently delivers 600 babies a month at Laniado and the new centre will accommodate for at least 700. These rooms and the nursery will be a fitting tribute to the Nathan family in that it is a constant celebration of life, a place their spirit and joie de vivre might carry on.

News from the hospital

Betty Retter Mother and Baby Centre

Laniado Hospital recently held a festive opening for its state-of-the-art Betty Retter Mother and Baby Medical Centre. The centre was dedicated by the Retter Family in memory of their dear mother, Blima Raizel.

Laniado Hospital is famed throughout Israel and surrounding areas for its maternity care. It is just completing a brand new maternity and neo-natal department on the third floor of the Children's Hospital, which will accommodate 700 babies a month. The glass atrium connects the new department with the current maternity unit and beautifies the panoramic view of the hospital.

The atrium includes an entrance lobby, which has now been unveiled with the memorial plaque for Betty Retter. Amongst the honoured

guests at the ceremony were The Grand Rabbi, The Rebbe of Sanz, The Chief Rabbi of Rechovot, Rabbi Simchah Kook and Cantor Binyamin Helfgott, all of whom participated in the event, which was followed by a celebratory meal.

The inauguration was completed when the Rebbe of Sanz affixed the mezuzah on the doorpost of the main entrance to the centre and honoured the eldest son, Daniel Retter, to share in this mitzvah.



Overcrowding

Early January was a very quiet time for the hospital with the average occupancy rate just slightly above normal due to the usual winter illnesses. Then, a flu epidemic broke out in the region and across Israel which pushed the occupancy rate over 150%. The dining rooms in the Internal Medicine Departments were turned into wards and beds lined the corridors. At a recent meeting of the hospital's board of directors it was emphasised that all efforts must be made to increase the number of beds in the hospital. Despite the challenges in the philanthropic world, work has begun on adding a new Cardiology Department. We are also proceeding with plans that will hopefully mean the realisation of building an Orthopaedic Wing.

Diabetes

An astonishing new statistic shows that the number of people suffering from diabetes has increased six-fold in the last ten years. From 3 million in 1995, to 170 million in 2000, and a figure which could reach 380 million by 2025. Over 6% of senior citizens now suffer from the disease and in Israel there are already 800,000 diabetics.

As a result of these new statistics, Israel held a "Diabetes Day" throughout the country. On that day the Gabriel Cabra Bildirici Diabetes Centre provided free examinations to visitors who were concerned about their sugar levels.

These patients were able to also receive free eye examinations and meet with dieticians and social workers in order to help monitor their health.

Saved by an angel

Dear friends of Laniado,

As a patient of Laniado, I would like to express my heartfelt thanks for the wonderful support and generosity that you give to this special hospital. You really help to save lives, mine being one of them.

In December 2006, I returned to Israel from a visit to England, where I developed a cold which I could not get rid of. The glands on my neck were enlarged and although not painful I was told to see a haematologist and that is when I met Dr Bulvik for the first time. I soon learned that he was the top haematologist at Laniado Hospital and highly respected by his colleagues and patients.

After a thorough examination he said that I had suspected lymphoma, and the tests confirmed that that I was already at an advanced stage of non-hodgkin's lymphoma. Dr Bulvik then suggested that I undergo a bone marrow biopsy. I had read up on this procedure and was very afraid of the pain, although, Ida, his head nurse, assured me that it would not be painful. The test results came back all clear – the lymphoma had not spread to my bone marrow.

Nurse Ida, who I adored and trusted, was a real matron in every sense of the word. The first thing she said to me was, "a lot of people don't like me but we are going to be friends". Who was I to argue at a time like that?

I was then sent to a hospital in Tel Aviv for another test which showed that the cancer had spread all over my body. Dr Bulvik told me, in no uncertain terms, that unless we start chemotherapy immediately, I would die.

As you can imagine, this was a shock not just for me, but for my wife and our young son, who was five. Their constant love and support helped me

get through the treatment and my recovery period and they continue to be a source of strength to me. My son is also a "Friend of Laniado" as he made friends with all the staff there and drew pictures to cheer up the patients in the ward.

The following day I returned to the hospital for my chemotherapy. I started losing my hair after my second treatment and also lost weight but I was progressing well. After four treatments I went for another scan to evaluate how things were going. The results showed a fifty percent reduction in the cancer, Dr Bulvik suggested that I have a colonoscopy. A biopsy was taken and I was shocked when the results showed up a second type of non-hodgkins lymphoma, known as mantle cell lymphoma, which is more difficult to treat and incurable.

I was devastated because I knew that the large B cell lymphoma was curable in 80% of patients, whereas the mantle cell lymphoma kills most people after three years – some people might make it to five. I felt like I had been given a death sentence. Dr Bulvik and his wonderful team of doctors and nurses discussed and even argued amongst themselves in my presence about the best form of treatment to give me. Their conclusions meant that I would have to be hospitalised for one week in every month. After my first treatment I felt so ill that in the middle of the night I told the nurse that I wanted to discontinue treatment. To my surprise, at 11pm Dr Bulvik arrived at my bedside. He had left a private function that he was attending to come and see me. Were it not for the tender and caring nature of Dr Bulvik and his wonderful team of nurses, I would not have been able to tolerate that particular treatment.

I used to have spiritual chats with a nurse named Lena, when she had a moment to herself. There was a time when I was unable to collect my prescription from the pharmacy and on her day off, Lena queued at the pharmacy for over an hour to

get my medicine. She made me smile even during my worst moments. The hospital also assigns a social worker to each patient, who support and help the whole family get through this difficult journey. One day, I woke up to find clowns in my room. I thought I was hallucinating but they turned out to be real and came every day to cheer us up after they had been to the children's ward, which was next door.

I can never thank Dr Bulvik (who I call the Ba'al Shem Tov) and his wonderful team of nurses enough. A lot of people at the hospital have become my friends, I feel that they were specially selected by G-d to carry out this very difficult and demanding work.

This story is a brief account of my experiences at Laniado – I could write a book about them. Despite their best efforts, Laniado is a charity based hospital and will always depend upon the generosity of people like yourselves and others. May all of you who have the ability to support this very special place please continue to do so, as your help makes such a difference to so many people...

2008 gala dinner

Professor Avishay Braverman MK, renowned Israeli economist, politician and former President of Ben Gurion University, was the guest of honour at Laniado UK's gala dinner at Banqueting House, Whitehall, sponsored by the Khalili family.

Addressing the multi-faith audience of over 400 supporters, including young leaders in finance, banking, property and media, Professor Braverman said: "Seeing young people in the room here tonight is refreshing, it gives me hope. Both Israel and the rest of the world need new energies, new ideas from the next generation. You are the best and the brightest."

Laniado UK is one of the only communal causes to have successfully garnered the support of the next generation of philanthropists. The charity has empowered its young supporters, encouraged their involvement and enlisted their active participation in shaping its future. The evening gave a voice to Laniado's young leaders, who used the platform to share their vision and to invite their guests to join them on the journey ahead.

In his welcoming words, dinner co-chair, Robert Suss laid down his challenge to his audience, when he said: "Laniado UK would like to entrust itself to you, the next generation of philanthropists and be steered by your inspiration, knowledge, skills, talent and motivation. It was deeply touching for a Muslim nurse to explain to me, a Christian, about a Jewish tradition on Shabbat. Our prayers may be different, we may not understand each other's languages, the structure of our religion may not be the same, but we all have one G-d and we share the same heartbeat."

Benjamin Khalili went on to say: "My time at Laniado left me with a lasting gift, a gift I want to share with you tonight. Volunteering at the hospital removed my doubt; the last speck of doubt that peace is not Utopia. I am now fearless in my endeavours towards achieving ethnic and religious harmony because I have seen it exist, with my own eyes."

In the closing remarks of the evening, Israel's Ambassador to the UK, Ron Prosor, paid tribute to the contribution of the young supporters in the room, saying: "Israel is a democracy under fire. With all its problems, it is a unique nation, with a wonderful youth who are dedicating the best years of their lives to defending the State of Israel, so that we all can dream about tomorrow. Inspired by the enthusiasm, drive and determination of the likes of the Laniado start-up team, together, we can unite and achieve beyond our wildest dreams."

The dinner raised over £550,000 for the new Emergency & Trauma Centre at the Netanya-based hospital.

His memorable character and passion to better the lives of the patients and doctors will be fondly cherished. May his memory be a blessing to his family and friends.

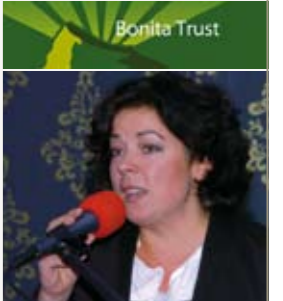
The Bonita Trust

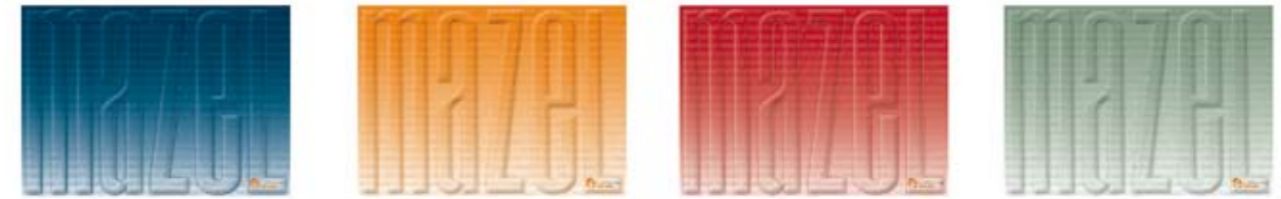
